AS PRESIDENT OF TENASKAPOWER SERVICES CO. (TPS), THE POWER MARKETING affiliate of Tenaska, Kevin R. Smith is responsible for the strategic direction and management of Tenaska's third-party energy management and power trading activities. He is a member of Tenaska's Board of Stakeholders and serves on management committees for various Tenaska business units.

TPS transacts physical and financial wholesale power throughout the United States and Canada, providing a comprehensive suite of energy management, congestion management, scheduling, settlement and market interface services for third-party customers throughout ERCOT, MISO, PJM, SERC, NYISO, SPP, AESO, CAISO, IESO, ISO-NE and WECC. TPS assists independent power producers, municipal and cooperative utilities, large industrial customers and competitive retailers in meeting load obligations and optimizing energy supply through a broad range of power marketing services, including transacting congestion revenue rights, Renewable Energy Certificates and emission allowances. TPS facilitates the purchase, sale and management of electric capacity, energy and ancillary services for its customers' generation facilities, providing energy risk management and financial and physical hedging.

Under Mr. Smith's leadership, TPS has expanded its geographic coverage and is the leading provider of energy management services for generation and demand-side customers in the United States.

Before being named president of TPS in 2012, Mr. Smith was senior vice president of the company's long-term marketing and business development activities. Prior to joining TPS in 1997, Mr. Smith was manager of power marketing for Delhi Energy Services, Inc., where he led the creation of Delhi's power marketing business and directed that group's activities.

Mr. Smith is involved in various industry activities, serving on the Members Committee of the Southwest Power Pool, the SERC Reliability Corporation Board and the Executive Committee of the Electric Power Supply Association.

Mr. Smith earned a Bachelor of Science in petroleum engineering from Texas A&M University and a Master of Business Administration from the University of Dallas.
